The Gospel is from St. Matthew 4:12-23. The prophet Isaiah announced a future of liberation and great joy for all of Galilee, through the image of light that dispels the darkness in which the people walk. The Gospel, quoting verbatim the same passage of the prophet Isaiah, presents Jesus as the Light thus fulfilling Isaiah's prophecy. He is the light that was promised to dispel the darkness of sin and to free man from the obscurity in which he is enclosed.

The light becomes an efficacious means to express God's involvement in human history. God manifests Himself as 'The Light' that disperses the darkness. The light illuminates, encircles, defines things, emphasises the colours and gives depth to space. The light heartens and comforts: to be in an enlightened place helps us to accept reality for what it is and makes one feel happier, more certain and protected.

God's initiative with regard to men permits them to have a renewed relationship with reality. In God's light everything assumes a new significance, its authentic and definitive meaning. A light which illuminates gives strength and permits the disclosure of the universe and man. This is why, after saying, 'on those who dwelt in the land of gloom a light has shone' (Is 9:1), the text adds, 'you have brought them abundant joy and great rejoicing' (Is 9:2).

A joy and happiness that became real in Jesus' presence. He is the promised light that has come into our midst, His physical presence that expresses the definitive arrival of the Light. The light that shines brightly marks



God's initiative performing His first merciful and free step towards a wounded humanity.

This dynamic is expressed through Jesus call of the first Apostles. He chooses them with an unequivocal call, 'Follow Me'. Faced with God's sudden interruption in their lives He invited them to abandon the nets and trust themselves totally to the Lord for a new 'catch', a new definitive horizon. At the Last Supper, the end of His earthly life, Jesus reminds His disciples 'you did not choose me, no, I chose you' (Jn 15:16). This Sunday's Gospel invites us to remember that our personal vocation is founded on God's original and absolutely free choice. His invitation towards us, therefore, is an invitation to make a final decision to let Him conquer or re-conquer us to mark a turning point in our lives.

Let us ask the Lord, for us and the whole Church, for the gift of a true conversion of our hearts enabling us to receive Christ as the only Light to follow. Christ is the only one that really dispels the darkness within and around us.

THIS WEEK'S QUESTION:

Q: "What should we be doing and not doing on the Sabbath? (After mass, of course) Hobbies? Watching the game on TV? Shopping? Going for a drive? Gardening? Cleaning house?"

Great question! Since the Church does not provide a strict list of do's and don'ts for Sundays, knowing exactly how to observe the Lord's Day can be difficult.

Traditionally, Christians were expected to abstain from unnecessary physical or "servile" labor. Under the 1917 Code of Canon Law, this made sense because the majority of people performed intense physical labor throughout the week on farms or in factories. In the 20th century, however, the nature of work changed significantly as many people began working desk jobs. As a result, physical activities such as gardening, light home projects, or mowing the lawn may actually be restful and recreational for some people.

When the Code of Canon Law was revised in 1983, the Church moved away from listing specific types of forbidden work and instead emphasized the underlying principles of Sunday observance. Canon Law 1247 now teaches that **the faithful are obliged to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation and to refrain from activities that hinder the worship owed to God, the joy proper to the Lord's Day, or the suitable rest of mind and body.**

Engaging in **hobbies or watching television** can be good ways to relax and are perfectly permissible, provided they do not distract from prayer, family life, or lifting the mind and heart to God.

Going to **restaurants or shopping** is not strictly prohibited, but should be limited when possible. The Catechism reminds us: "Every Christian should avoid making unnecessary demands on others that would hinder them from observing the Lord's Day" (CCC 2195).

Deep **cleaning** is generally not recommended as a recreational Sunday activity. While many people find it difficult to relax in a cluttered space, it is best—when possible—to prepare for the Lord's Day on Saturday by cleaning ahead of time. This helps create a peaceful environment that fosters rest and contemplation on Sunday. Of course, some light and necessary tasks—such as washing dishes or picking up toys—are unavoidable.

Simply put, Sunday should be set aside as a day of worship (above all through attending Mass), rest, and recreation, in a way that looks different from the rest of the week and draws us closer to God.
