The Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time



The Gospel is taken from St. Luke (Luke 6:27-38). It would at first sight appear that the demands that Christ makes on our charity here are anything but easy. Loving one's enemies is asking a lot. Blessing them and praying for them might be all right for St. Francis but expecting it of us seems to be going very far. Asking for a blow on the second cheek while the first is still twinging with pain seems fit only for a martyr. Not to try to take tack what was stolen from us looks very foolish. Yet it was Christ who made all these demands.

However, before we give up in despair, and decide that this type of Christianity is not for us, let us look a little more closely at the demands that are made. To love our enemy does not mean we must throw our arms about him every time we meet him (he would not let us anyway!). It means we must do all in our power to rid our minds of any hatred of him, and try to see the good that is in him. Not judging and condemning comes under this heading. Human sinful beings that we are, our faculty for seeing in our neighbor the real man as he is before God, is very limited and very prone to error. There are justly convicted robbers and murderers in our jails, in whom God can see a lot of goodness even now, and perhaps future citizens of heaven later on.

Not demanding back what was unjustly taken from us does not mean that we may not have recourse to the legal or other means available to us for obtaining compensation in such cases. What it does forbid is personal (generally forceful) restoration of our rights and property.

Another consoling point to bear in mind is that the vast majority of our fellowmen have no inclination to injure us in our person or our property and will never do so. If we feel we have a lot of enemies only waiting for the chance to pounce on us, we would do well to examine our own consciences very carefully and then look for the many good points there are in our neighbour's character.

"An eye for an eye, a tooth for a tooth, life for life" was the practice amongst the Jews at the time of Christ and for centuries before (Ex. 21:23-25). Christ sets up the "golden rule" of fraternal charity in place of this Law of Talon. Every man should truly love his neighbor for he is his brother. What is more, Christ's mission on earth has made him a son of God and an heir to heaven. Our chief interest in our neighbor must therefore be a spiritual interest. If he offends us, he offends God which is much more serious. Our charity should help him to seek God's forgiveness. That he should seek ours is of very minor importance in comparison with that.

You would like your neighbour to help you to reach heaven. "You go and do likewise" to your neighbor, and you will both get there.



Pilgrimage Sites in WV Announced for Jubilee Year of Hope



"May the grace of the Jubilee reawaken in us, Pilgrims of Hope, a yearning for the treasures of heaven," Bishop Mark Brennan said at the opening of the Jubilee Year in the diocese from the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Wheeling.

Let this Year of Hope energize our mission to lead others to Jesus. your trust in God who created From now to December 28, 2025, Catholics from all over WV are invited to visit any and all of these locations obtain a Jubilee Indulgence called for by Pope Francis. A Jubilee Indulgence is obtained

1. Make a brief pilgrimage to one of the four **locations designated** as a pilgrimage site within the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston as a sign of your deep desire for true conversion and hope in the Lord's Goodness.

- 2. Pray. Devoutly participate in one of the following at any of the four locations:
 - Holy Mass
 - Liturgy of the Hours (office of readings, lauds, vespers)
 - Via Crucis (Way of the Cross/Stations of the Cross)
 - Rosary
- 3. Confess in the Sacrament of Reconciliation within twenty days before or after your pilgrimage.
- 4. Receive Holy Communion, reflecting on the hope God gives.
- 5. Pray for the Pope and for the intentions that he bears in his heart for the good of the Church and of the entire world. Any prayer may be said, according to personal devotion, but the Our Father and Hail Mary are suggested.

Additionally, important to note, the Plenary Indulgence can be applied for yourself or souls of the deceased, but not other living souls. Further, a Plenary Indulgence can be gained only once per day. Though, a second can be obtained if it is applied to the souls in purgatory.

Each Jubilee Year brings with it the opportunity for the faithful to gain a Jubilee indulgence. To quote the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC), an indulgence is "a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints" (CCC 1471).

Cathedral of St. Joseph, Wheeling - principal Mass Sunday 10:30am




Originally known as St. James Parish, the church was completed in 1823. It was the first church built in what became the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston. The earliest parishioners were primarily Irish and German immigrants. A second church was built in 1849, and when the Diocese of Wheeling was created in 1850, St. James became the cathedral parish. The patronage was officially changed to St. Joseph in 1872.

St. Joseph Cathedral has been a center of Catholic life in Wheeling and the diocese from the time of its humble wood frame in 1823 to the majesty of its Romanesque carved stone, completed in 1926. All city parishes and many throughout the northern panhandle were

formed from the St. Joseph Cathedral.

Various schools for boys and girls have been attached to the parish as far back as 1848, staffed by the Sisters of St. Joseph, Xaverian Brothers, Marist Brothers, and lay teachers. Central Catholic High School was established in 1898.

Basilica of the Co-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart, Charleston - principal Mass Sunday 10:30am



Located in the capitol city of Charleston, Sacred Heart parish was established in 1866 by Rev. Joseph Stenger, affectionately remembered as the "Apostle of the Kanawha Valley." The first pastorate was spread over Kanawha, Boone, Clay, Fayette, Nicholas, and Putnam counties. Mass was celebrated in a rented storefront until the first church was built in 1866. The second and current church was completed in 1897.

Diocesan priests staffed Sacred Heart until 1901 when Bishop Patrick J. Donahue invited the Capuchin Friars to take charge of the parish. The Capuchins remained at Sacred Heart until 1980, when the parish was transferred back to diocesan control.

In 1974, Sacred Heart was designated the Co-Cathedral of the

diocese, and in 2009 was named a minor basilica. Considered the mother church of the Kanawha Valley, many area parishes can trace their origin to Sacred Heart. The parish's first school was opened in 1867, and the present school was established in 1903. Central High School was established in 1923.

St. Patrick Church, Weston - principal Mass Sunday 10:30 am



A Catholic presence had been established in Weston as early as 1820 with many Irish and German immigrants who had labored on the Staunton & Parkersburg Turnpike. A priest from Pittsburgh visited the area until Rev. Austin Grogan was sent to Weston in 1845. Grogan was responsible for serving all of the Catholic faithful in central West Virginia. Mass was celebrated in private homes in Weston until a church was built in 1848, at which point St. Patrick was elevated to a parish, one of the earliest established in West Virginia. The earlier church was replaced in 1914 by the current stately stone church built by future bishop of Wheeling, Rev. John J. Swint.

St. Patrick has operated two grade schools (1855 – 1878; 1914 – present) and a high school (1918 – 1973). The Sisters of St. Joseph served the parish at Weston for nearly a century.

St. Joseph, Martinsburg - principal Mass Sunday 10:30 (English) Noon (Spanish)



Martinsburg was one of the earliest centers of Catholicism in the state, dating back to the late 1790s. The families gathered for Mass in private homes and later a rented house until the first church, St. John, was completed in 1830. The parish's second and present church was completed in 1860 and dedicated to St. Joseph. The church sustained significant damage during the Civil War, with the main floor serving as an occasional hospital and the basement as a stable for the soldiers' horses. St. Joseph remains the oldest Catholic church in the eastern panhandle of West Virginia. A parochial school was opened in Martinsburg in 1870 and staffed by lay teachers until the arrival of the Sisters of Charity in 1883. A new school building was completed in 2000, with plans to open a high school in 2025.

Diocese Announces Disaster Assistance Fund **Special Collection Specifically for WV Flood Victims**

Bishop Brennan Authorized a Challenge Grant of \$50,000 through WVCF

Thursday, February 20, 2025

WHEELING—Recovery efforts continue across the Mountain State after the severe flooding that occurred earlier this month. Several counties have experienced generational flooding resulting in loss of life, property, and livelihood. More than ten counties in our state remain under a State of Emergency. With many roads just being re-opened, the scope of the devastation is becoming more visible. Most Rev. Mark Brennan, Bishop of the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston, has approved a special collection to be held the weekends of February 22-23 and March 1-2 in all parishes and missions throughout the diocese to support recovery efforts related to the series of disasters that have occurred. Checks should be made out to your respective parish with "Disaster Relief" on the memo line. Donations can also be made on the diocesan website at dwc.org/disaster-relief/.

All of the money collected will remain in West Virginia and will be managed by Catholic Charities West Virginia (CCWVa). Money will be allocated along a fourtier priority list as follows:

- 1. Parishes in and around the affected area who directly assist families willreceive funds to give aid to those in need.
- 2. CCWVa Regional staff will receive funding for direct, short-termrecovery assistance to victims.
- 3. Partner agencies who work with CCWVa to administer relief to West Virginia residents affected by the flooding.
- 4. Funds will be given to CCWVa for long-term humanitarian and recovery efforts. This fund assist families long after other organizations have moved out help families and individuals in the rebuilding process to restore safe, secure, and sanitary living conditions.

To help jumpstart the collection and speed funding to assist West Virginia families, Bishop Brennan, has authorized a challenge grant in the amount of \$50,000 through the West Virginia Catholic Foundation. These funds will be immediately distributed for relief efforts in our state. Bishop Mark hopes the donation will spur others to give generously to help our neighbors in need.

Please remember in prayer all those whose lives have been changed in the wake of these disasters. Let us come together now to support our brothers and sisters in Christ who have been injured and lost their homes, cars, employment, and access to food and water.

Sometimes, it feels like Lent is just about giving up chocolate. But deep down, we all desire to do something more for Lent—we just don't know how to do it.

How to Lent is a new series from the Augustine Institute that aims to equip Catholics with the tools to understand and practice the pillars of Lent: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Guided by Solenne Santiago and with the help of priests and religious, this series will challenge our preconceived notions about Lent, laying out a roadmap for entering the season with a purpose. 
