WE WILL LEAVE MASS IN SILENCE DURING THE SEASON OF LENT.

The Second Sunday of Lent



The Gospel is from St. Luke 9:28-36. It was out of the abundance of his divine love that God gave a glimpse of the future glory of Christ in his risen humanity to the three disciples on that memorable occasion. And with Christ he showed two others of his faithful servants also in glory. He understood the human weakness of the disciples, and foresaw the shock to their faith which the sad scenes of the passion and crucifixion of their beloved Master would be some weeks later. So, to strengthen and forearm them for that sad trial, he gave them a glimpse of the future glory which was to be theirs, too, if they persevered.

It is for this same reason that this all-important event in the life of Christ and of his Apostles has been preserved for us in the Gospels and is put before us today.

Like the Apostles, we. too, believe firmly in God. We. too, are convinced that Christ was sent by God to bring us to heaven. We now have much more convincing proof that Christ was not only the Messiah, an envoy of God, but the very Son of God—something the Apostles did not then understand. But we are still very like them in our human weakness, and in our half-hearted acceptance of God's purpose for and promises to us.

The Apostles had to face the awful test to their faith and trust in God, which the passion and crucifixion of Christ was for them. We now accept with gratitude and realize that Christ "had to suffer and thus enter into his glory." We even understand that the very purpose of Christ's passion was that, in spite of our mortality and weakness, we also might enter into eternal glory through his suffering, on condition that we remain true to our faith.

In our moments of cool, calm reasoning we can see clearly how good God has been to us, how wonderful his love which has arranged for us an eternity of happiness, the perfect fulfillment of every rational human desire. We can also see how little God asks of us during our few short years here, in return for the everlasting happy home he has prepared for us.

But unfortunately we have many moments in life in which cool, calm reasoning does not prevail. We have moments when our vices and not our virtues take charge, moments when we are prepared to sell our eternal heritage in exchange for a mess of earthly pottage. Some of us may already have bartered our heavenly home for some temporal gain or pleasure—but while there is life there is hope. We can still put things right with God.

"Lord, it is good for us to be here"; it is wonderful to be adopted sons of God on the road back to our Father. It is wonderful to be assured that in death this body of ours with its pains and aches, its attraction to earthly things and worse still its propensity to sin, will give place to a glorified body. This glorified body will be free from all pain and corruption and will possess all the human spiritual gifts of intelligence and will to so much greater a degree as will enable us to appreciate and enjoy the eternal happiness in store for us.

Stations of the Cross, Fridays @ 6:00 PM



The 14 Stations of the Cross:

- 1.) Jesus is condemned to death
- 2.) Jesus carries His cross
- 3.) Jesus falls the first time
- 4.) Jesus meets His Mother
- 5.) Simon of Cyrene helps Jesus carry His cross
- 6.) Veronica wipes the face of Jesus
- 7.) Jesus falls the second time
- 8.) Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem
- 9.) Jesus falls a third time
- 10.) Jesus clothes are taken away
- 11.) Jesus is nailed to the cross
- 12.) Jesus dies on the cross
- 13.) The body of Jesus is taken down from the cross
- 14.) Jesus is laid in the tomb

In order to gain a plenary indulgence by praying the Stations, the following 4 things must be done:

- 1.) It must be made where the Way of the Cross (Stations of the Cross) is legitimately erected, this is most of the time at a Church.
- 2.) All 14 stations must be present and represented. Fourteen crosses are required, and it is also customary for most places to add pictures or images of the station.
- 3.) Meditation on the Passion and Death of the Lord must be observed throughout the prayers and stations.
- 4.) A movement from one station to the next is required.
- If, for various reasons, it is not possible for all those attending to physically move from station to station, it suffices for the indulgence if at least the individual conducting the stations physically moves from station to station and the others are permitted to remain in their place. Additionally, if you are unable to attend or pray the stations physically at a location where they are erected, you can still gain the plenary indulgence if you spend a minimum of a half an hour in pious reading and meditation of the Passion and Death of our Lord Jesus Christ. 






RING IN ST. PATRICK'S DAY!

Have you heard about the bell? According to legend, there were many St. Patrick bells.

It is believed that as St. Patrick helped set up a church or Christian community before he left the area, he would give the leader a bell. The idea was the bell would be used to call the community to prayer.

The Bell of the Will of St. Patrick is showcased at the National Museum of Ireland. Faithful Irish believe it belonged to their patron saint. The actual bell is about seven inches high and in the shape of sheep bell. It is made out of iron and coated in bronze. In ancient Ireland these bells were venerated as holy objects and therefore given to a bell keeper, who often buried the bells for safe keeping. The bell was said to have been buried with St. Patrick but retrieved 60 years after his death. It was presented to Ármagh as a precious relic. An ornate cover was made for the bell around 1100 AD - more than 600 years after St. Patrick died. There have been many keepers of that bell through the centuries, but it was finally bequeathed to the nation. The bell is part of a permanent exhibit in the Treasury Gallery at the National Museum of Ireland in Dublin.

The Breastplate

Saint Patrick's Breastplate is actually a prayer to shield us from evil. It is believed he wrote this prayer for divine protection in 433 AD and would have used it in his efforts to convert the pagan people of Ireland to Christianity. The lengthy prayer, also known as the Lorica Prayer, is most recognizable in its shortened version of 15 lines:

Christ with me. Christ before me. Christ behind me. Christ in me. Christ beneath me. Christ above me, Christ on my right, Christ on my left, Christ when I lie down. Christ when I sit down, Christ when I arise, Christ in the heart of every man who thinks of me. Christ in the mouth of everyone who speaks of me. Christ in every eye that sees me. Christ in every ear that hears me....
